

MINISTER FACES HEARING

Finis Dake Charged With Mann Act Violation.

CHICAGO. (AP). Separated from his flock at the Zion City, Ill., Pentecostal church by a charge of violating the Mann act, Rev. Finis Jennings Dake, 35, faced a hearing before a U. S. commissioner on proceedings to remove him to Milwaukee for trial. Arraigned on an indictment charging he transported a 16 year old girl from Kenosha, Wis., to East St. Louis, Ill., for immoral purposes, he was unable to furnish \$2,000 bail.

The indictment against the handsome, 200-pound, blond minister was returned at Milwaukee last February and that the alleged offense occurred in April, 1935. It was charged that on an automobile trip Emma Barelle and the minister registered at Waukegan and Bloomington, Ill., hotels as "Mr. and Mrs. Anderson." Mrs. Dake, herself an ordained minister, defended her husband, saying Miss Barelli was a hitch-hiker whom Rev. Mr. Dake took to East St. Louis to give a home with his sister.
