

LACKS \$2,000, PASTOR JAILED

"I Wanted to Get Her a Job."

Illinois Minister Denies Mann Act Charges.

CHICAGO, ILL. (AP)—Unable to post a \$2,000 bond, the Rev. Finis Jennings Dake, 35, pastor of the Christian assembly church of Zion, Ill., was remanded to jail Wednesday on Mann act charges, involving a 16-year-old girl.

Dake, who had hoped to win his release to attend a prayer meeting at his church Wednesday night, offered real estate for his bond, but federal authorities said it was insufficient.

He agreed to permit his removal to Milwaukee, Wis., where a federal grand jury indicted him last February for allegedly transporting Emma Barelli from Kenosha, Wis., to East St. Louis, Ill., but denied the accusation.

"I did take her there," Dake said. "But there was no immorality involved. I wanted to get her a job."

The minister is married and the father of an 8-year-old daughter.
